Proceeds and sponsorship of Fire Fest benefit the Fire Museum's outreach and education programming, as well as VJTF and its programs to train firefighters. The purpose of the event is to raise awareness about fire departments in the Houston area, and raise awareness among children and their parents of fire and life safety. Admission to the event is free

Jumping ahead a week to the Pump Primer muster on July 12 -13th... as I shot pictures of the 100+ fire trucks arriving and seeing 3 of the fire trucks I had missed out buying in 2011, I realized that if I had bought one of those and not the Harrisburg CF with all its history, I would not be visiting in Harrisburg and becoming friends with so many people in area. The rest of this story would not exist.

Back to the beginning of our trip. There were several items on our schedule to do; retrieve pictures from the Harrisburg stations of our fire truck in action, go through some files of pictures taken by a local photographer, and participate in some side trips.

After visiting one night at Harrisburg FD Station 6, The Paxton, our plans changed. Robert Sharpe set up a tour for us in Hanover at the fire museum, and after much planning and talking the next day we head to Schuylkill County Historical Fire Society in Shenandoah to visit a museum and building packed with 50-60 fire trucks. Then off to the KME fire truck factory to go through their scratch and dent warehouse. This place is literally a candy store for firefighters. They promised me they would ship anything I found; only thing, there was too much to ship!

The 2nd is Squad 8...Mt Pleasant (our engine ran out of this station). The 3rd Station #1. The older picture is the Reily #10 which is the fire museum now.

Another unplanned roadtrip - we headed to Shenandoah ..with Jason seen in one of the famous Mary Austin Hose Company shirt and Robert Sharpe to the right lead the way to "The Lyric" diner and bar for lunch in Pa. coal country. LEE HOWL HAND PUMPER

Texas Gulf Coast member Terry Parker brought his recently-rebuilt hand pumper to its must début during the 28th Annual Tyler muster (see Front page). The pump is a British-made Lee Howl manufactured between 1938 and 1952 as both a shipboard binge pump and/or a fire pump for civilian or military service. The 2—4 person pump has a single 4 1/4 inch diameter cylinder and pumps very easily.

I found it on eBay where someone had bought it from an estate sale of a firefighter. From the looks of it I was sure I could make some sort of hand pumper out of it. I looked at several pictures of smaller hand pumpers, and my dad and I just made one. This first one is a prototype that is currently riding on a metal frame with pneumatic tires. I hope to build a different

base for it down the road. The tub is basically 2 ft by 4 ft by 16 inches deep.

The pump was painted red originally. When I cleaned it up and found it was solid brass (except for the part where the handles attach) I couldn't bring my self to paint it again.

Clinton Johnson had the following to add: "For a while with Jim and Bill operating the handles, it must have pumped nearly as much as Chuck Buschardt's ALF until it 'ran out of gas'. When Terry bought the pump, it looked more like a lump or tarnish than a pump. Only he would have recognized it for what it was. Nice thing—it gets better gas mileage than most of our other pumpers."
